#### **About the Program**

The new PDPM for Medicare payment classification will take effect October 1, 2019 and will significantly change Medicare reimbursement for skilled nursing facilities. This payment model which will tie SNF reimbursement to value, rather than therapy volume, will be based on a patient's needs, determined using ICD-10 diagnoses codes, patient characteristics and other clinically relevant factors. Facilities need to start planning now to make changes to their staffing and operations for the October 2019 implementation.

- In order to prepare for PDPM, your staff need to be ready to document the resident's functional scores using Section GG, ICD-10CM/PCS code mapping, determining rehab clinical category, calculating Non-Therapy Ancillary scoring points with adjustment factor, calculating the nursing component, and pass audit.
- Find out why it is important to rejuvenate your nursing rehab program.
- Will you need more MDS nursing staff or more rehab therapists?
- Identify financial implications related to these changes.
- Identify training needs for administrative and clinical staff in preparation for PDPM.
- Preparing source documents and/or supportive documentation that meet PDPM rules.
- How will you know that your MDS nurses are data capturing all the opportunities to meet the PDPM classification rules.
- Determine how performance improvements and reimbursements are aligned in the new PDPM process.
- Discuss how the facility can prepare for the coming of PDPM using basic lean management tools.
